CSI is now offering a creative dance class with a Jewish flavor for children and adults age 3 and up, taught by Sharona Rubinstein!

The class will include:

- Basic dance technique
- Structured improvisation to explore the elements of dance
- Exercises that build strength and increase flexibility
- Israeli Line and Circle Dances
- Group and partner activities
- Performance opportunities
- Lots of fun for everyone!!

The classes meet on the Sundays when Sunday school is in session, and will take place in the social hall from 1-2PM beginning Oct. 28th, except on Dec. 14 when it will be from 3-4 since Sunday school starts later at 4 to occur before the family night.

Fees per child (parents come for free) are as follows:
\$15 per class if you pay by the class
\$60 if you pay for the 5 classes of the Fall semester
\$144 for the 12 classes of the Winter/Spring semester.

Parents must fill out a liability waiver form for their child and themselves if they participate. Bring a light lunch if your child attends Sunday school so they can take a lunch break from 12:30-1:00. They should bring dance clothes or workout clothes and have hair pulled back. 
